

Hospitality House Turns 18! A Word From An Organization Founder Pam Jansen reflects on 18 years of serving our community

When Tracy Moore, Pastor Judy May and I had our very first casual conversation about community outreach, I'm sure I speak for all three of us when I say we never expected quite the incredible organization Hospitality House has become today. This organization began in a coffee shop. Lorrie McVey joined us almost immediately and we began brainstorming about how we could make a positive difference in our community. We next invited Pastor Pulkenen and Joann Sovel to our discussions. We wanted to identify what need(s) our three small congregations could possibly help resolve.

We reached out to local organizations, churches, government agencies and school leaders and found that food assistance was the most critical need at the time. It became clear that our mission would be food supplementation for our neighbors in need.

Realizing the project would take the work of many, we named it "United We Serve." It was not until later we adopted the name Hospitality House and had a community contest to develop the logos you are familiar with today.

Continuing our due diligence, we formed a 501c3, created our first Board of Directors and opened our first panty in the back of the First Baptist Church on February 14, 2002. Between our first and current locations, we spent time in spaces graciously provided by St. Anne's Episcopal Church, Church of Christ and our first leased space on Maple Road.

The most important part of our journey were the many volunteers and organizations who gave of their time, talent and money to create and grow Hospitality House into the community it is today.
