Outrun Hunger 2020



Despite challenges from COVID-19, the Outrun Hunger 5K run/walk had a record year, raising more than \$23,000 to support families in the Lakes Area. The event proceeds surpassed their goal of \$20,000, raising \$23,181.37 that was distributed equally between Hospitality House and Open Door **Outreach Center**

In 2020, Outrun Hunger raised \$33,877 to benefit both charity partners through pandemic fundraising in June and the 5K charity event. Their fundraising fed 1.693 families!

"I want to personally thank the community for showing up and supporting those in need," Race Director Kari Cotter said. "Whether you joined us inperson, sponsored or donated, you were a huge part of Outrun Hunger's 10th annual charity event's record success.

According to Cotter, this year's event featured 249 racers, 51 volunteers, 113 donors and 12 sponsors

Donovan Neal, executive director of Hospitality House, remarked on the success of Outrun Hunger. "Outrun Hunger continues to be a stabilizing force during these challenging times. With over \$11,000 raised for Hospitality House, the participants, organizers and sponsors continue to impact the Lakes Area community through this wonderful event. These funds could not have come at a better time; the holiday season is when we typically receive the most cries for help. This year is no different, and Hospitality House expects to distribute turkeys to over 400 households this year. We are forever grateful to Kari Cotter, Grace Church and all those involved in helping to make this year's event a success



The Student Pantry Finds a New Home

Hospitality House is a proud supporter and partner of the Student Pantry. This past summer, the group officially became a 501c3 organization and moved! The Student Pantry's new headquarters is located at 8318 Cooley Lake Road in Commerce Township.

The Student Pantry launched in 2014 when Sydney Urbaniak, a then-middle school student, realized that many of her classmates were in need of clothes, school

supplies and food. "I couldn't believe that there were so many students in Walled Lake who were without food when many families in the same area are so wealthy. We have been growing since 2014 but the COVID-19 pandemic accelerated the need. We outgrew my garage and had to find a larger space," said Urbaniak, now a senior at Walled Lake Central High School.

2020: Hospitality House's Year in Review

- Provided 4 months of emergency housing to Oakland County families
 - Distributed nearly 52,000 pounds of food per month
 - Provided food assistance to 516 new families
- Distributed over \$5,000 in utility assistance to gualifying Oakland County residents
- Backpacks and school supplies provided to over 100 children
- Doubled the number of individuals assisted via Pit Stop, Hospitality House's auto repair program
- Santa Shop, Hospitality House's holiday program, provided holiday gifts to the children of 165 client families
- Hired three additional temporary employees through the Oakland Together Community Response and Recovery Fund, established by the Oakland County Executive and Board of Commissioners and administered by United Way for Southeastern Michigan
- Provided clients with a total of 621,683 pounds of food: the most in the organization's 20 year history!

Western Oakland Transportation **Authority Delivery Partnership**

Hospitality House, Western Oakland Transportation Authority (WOTA) and Open Door Outreach Center recently announced their collaboration to provide monthly food delivery service for clients in need.

WOTA provides transportation to seniors (55 and older) and disabled adults (18 and older) who are residents of Highland, Walled Lake. Waterford and White Lake. Open Door Outreach Center and Hospitality House provide food and financial assistance to the most vulnerable in these communities.

Hospitality House clients living in the city of Walled Lake can now sign up to have food delivered to their door. It's a wonderful new collaboration and we are elated to be a part of it!
